Easter: when the world says no and God says yes.

The closer we get to Easter one thing gets clear: Easter is God's great yes. God said yes when Jesus stepped out of the tomb to new life for all creation and for every one of us. The gifts Jesus shared as Jesus rose from the dead are new life, freedom, hope, forgiveness, peace, and joy.

Jesus' Easter gift of new life is the Good News this world needs. Our mission as a church is to keep on telling the story of God's death defeating love. We need the news: God says yes to new life for us AND all creation.

You might ask, if God is saying yes, is somebody or something else is saying no. Sadly, the evidence is all around us, lots of powers and forces are saying no. The last few years I've been reminded, as my parents go through major health crises that life is fragile. Our own bodies bear the evidence of our mortality. Easter is God's yes to us even after death. The news of war and economic uncertainty reminds us all how interconnected and tangled up this world is. And Easter is when we hear God's yes even when the world seems uncertain. Easter means real freedom, hope, and joy not based in our circumstances. Jesus forever breaks the bonds of sin, death, and evil – God says yes no matter what the people or powers of this world might do.

This world needs God's love — it's the same thing that I need personally. When I feel overwhelmed I most need to hear the Good News. I need to hear the old story — the God of love, grace, and mercy died and rose again. I need the Good News that Jesus says yes to new life for me and for all creation.

This year the greatest gift we can share at Easter is to tell the story of resurrection and new life.


April 2023 (cont'd)

In my childhood the week leading up to Easter meant worship. My folks made sure we heard the story of Jesus' death and rising every year. Palm Sunday, Maundy/Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday – the heart of Jesus' story is told in just a few days. These days and this story meant something to my dad and mom. I just assumed the story of Jesus death and rising was just as important for everyone. But I've learned most people don't know the story.

As a pastor I've learned the story of Jesus love revealed in his cross and empty tomb isn't all that familiar. As a dad, with young adult children, it gets clearer most young people know very little of the Easter story. This is our moment as a church – to learn new ways to tell the story. Jesus' story – the Good News ours to share. We're trying on Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, and Twitter. We are learning new ways to share the Good News God says yes even when the forces of sin, death, and evil say no.

My hope for us at St John's, Immanuel, and Good Hope — and for every church and every follower of Jesus this Easter season is that know the Good News, God is saying yes to new life for you. Blessings and thanks for reading.

10 MINUTE BIBLE STUDY



7 Words from the Cross

There's an old tradition among some Swedes and Norwegians – listening to the 7 short sentences that Jesus spoke as he was dying. These "7 words" from the cross are beloved and sometimes haunting. What Jesus had to say as he died is foundational to the faith.

A person could spend quite some time pondering and considering each of these simple sentences. The words and the story of the cross don't change – but over the years we read and hear these words anew. These simple sentences both convict us and give us so much hope.

As you read think about what you hear from Jesus. What about these words of Jesus' give you hope? What in Jesus' words from the cross challenge you and convict you?

1st Word: "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing. Luke 23:34

2nd Word: "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Luke 23:43

3rd Word: "Woman, here is your son." "Here is your mother." John 19:26-27

4th Word: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:46 Mark 15:34

5th Word: "I thirst" John 19:28

6th Word: "It is finished" John 19:30

7th Word: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Luke 23:46

This year as we hear the story of the cross on Good Friday these short sentences invite us into Jesus' own thoughts as he died. We hear him pray – we hear him forgive – we hear him speak to people he loved – he said it all while he was dying. This is what God's love revealed for the world looked and sounded like on Good Friday.

If time allows look up these 7 sentences in the 4 Gospels.

Look not only at the words Jesus said, look at the context. Jesus spoke with great power even as he died — and the best news of all is that his death wasn't the end — it was the new beginning for all creation.


