Easter and ripples.

If you have ever thrown a stone into a lake you know what a ripple looks like. The bigger the stone and the quieter the water the clearer the ripples. The farther from shore a person throw the stone the farther out they see the ripples as they spread across the water.

As a dad with three young girls I used to love to go to the lakeshore with my daughters. It was fun on a calm evening to go and skip some stones. Sometimes we just heaved a big rock out watched the ripples after the splash. We saw how the ripples spread in the light of sunset.

Sometimes we could see the ripples bounce into and off other ripples.

I think of Easter morning as the biggest event is history. And I imagine Easter as the point impact at center of ripple that is still spreading. The moment when Jesus stepped out of the tomb God moved. And the waves of Easter have been spreading for 2000 years.

Jesus' resurrection had a big impact and that impact is still being felt across the world today. For us the joy is helping spread the story and watching the waves of God's grace and mercy spread. The flow into this world that needs Jesus as much now as ever before.

Easter is for everyone,

Deep down the Easter story is about God making something new happen. Some people 2000 years ago said that a man overcoming death was impossible even for God—but the Good News is God doesn't care what we think is possible or impossible.. As church celebrating the day Jesus

rose from the dead is our biggest day—it's our biggest celebration.

As we celebrate Easter this year I'm thinking about the way Easter can ripple across time and space.

After Easter Jesus spoke to the fears and locked hearts of his friends. Even on the night of Easter Jesus friend we're afraid. And Jesus spoke to them in their fear—Peace be with you.

He says it again to us in our fears and worries—Peace be with you.

This month after Easter is a great time to look for the ripples of new life in the world. On Easter night Jesus offered his friends peace and then he sent them out on a mission from the Father.

We join in with those ancient spreading wave of mercy and grace.

We don't go alone. Jesus sends the Spirit with us as we go into the world announcing forgiveness for sins and a new chance for sinners.

Some say, no. Some say there's got to be a limit to God's power and mercy and grace. But in Jesus resurrection we see the truth—the limits are gone for God.

There is no limit to the love, grace, mercy, and power of God who made heaven and earth and who brought the Lord Jesus Christ back to life after 3 days in the grave.

The joy we find is spreading the Good News—and watching it ripple across the world.

10 Minute Bible Study April 2024 Jesus after Easter appearances

The Biggest story in the Christian scripture is Easter. The 4 Gospels tell great stories about Jesus meeting his friends again after rising from the dead. John 20-21 is filled with after Easter moments when fear and doubt were replaced with joy and .

Read John 20:1-2

Mary Magdalene went to Jesus tomb and found it empty. Jesus came back to live—but no one realized it vet.

What do you make of Mary's initial reaction?

Read John 20:3-8

Mary had news to share and she looked to tell the other disciples. Peter and another disciple headed straight for the tomb. They had to see for themselves. What did the disciples find?

What didn't the disciples find at the tomb.

Read John 20:9

What does it mean to say the didn't "understand the scripture"?

Read John 20:10-15

Jesus was talking with Mary Magdalene and she didn't recognize him.

What do you imagine was going through Mary's imagination as she talked with this man who she thought was the gardener?

Read John 20:16-18

Mary Magdalene didn't recognize Jesus until he called her by name. How does hearing Jesus call Mary's name change how she looked at everything?

How does Mary Magdalene's story change how you see the world?


