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#### Dear Friends In Christ,

Lord, help me to focus on what is important today.

Some days it seems like our feet are running before they ever hit the floor in the morning. Arising from our beds we face a day of demands, some of our own making while others are because of jobs, school, even marriage and family.

We may see all of those demands as just the way life is. Those demands may even give us a feeling of importance because so many need us. However, that way of life can become rather exhausting. Those demands become more than demands as they pull us here and there. Prayers for strength seem to go unanswered. We might even find ourselves a bit irritable.

Do all of those demands ever leave you frustrated, even angry?

Martha welcomed Jesus into her home. She began working, and working, and working. She was doing what was expected when entertaining guests. As she worked hard to make sure Jesus and his disciples were cared for she felt overwhelmed. Meanwhile, her sister sat at the feet of Jesus and listened to him.

Martha had too much to do. As she was being dragged in so many directions trying to care for those she loved she became angry that her sister was not helping her.

"Jesus, tell her to get in here and help me!"

Jesus' response was not to tell Mary to get to work but to speak ever so gently saying, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her" Mary was focused on the right thing, on Jesus, while Martha was being dragged this way and that by all the tasks she thought were important but in reality distracted her from what was truly important.

Have you ever prayed for the strength to get everything done that needs to be completed?

When the demands of life become too much we no longer have time for God. We may justify our life with God by thinking such things as, "I pray all of the time" or "I don't need to go to church to pray." While such statements may be true, they attempt to slip Jesus into our lives in between the demands rather than making him the most important.

I have found that when I let myself become too busy, pulled in this direction and that direction, my body gives out in exhaustion and illness. Everything that was so important is no longer urgent. I discover that I am not so important in keeping things going as I am forced to take time to rest. When this happens to any of us, we have the time to listen to God answer our prayers as He tells us what is important. Does God give us the strength to do more or does God speak to us like He spoke to Martha, "you are distracted by too many things." Jesus told Martha, "Mary has chosen the right thing."

We must take time each day to stop for awhile to listen to Jesus. Each week, it is important for us to stop from all of the busyness to go to worship and sit at the feet of Jesus. The deliberate break from everything to sit quietly, sing hymns, listen to the Bible read and explained, to participate in the prayers. Changing our clothes, taking a deliberate break from everything, travelling to church are all an important break from the demands of life that remind us what is the most important thing in life.

If you are not taking that break, try it. At first it might seem like another demand but as worship becomes a routine part of your week you will find that sitting at the feet of Jesus will become most important. Like Mary, you will chose the better part, which will not be taken from you.

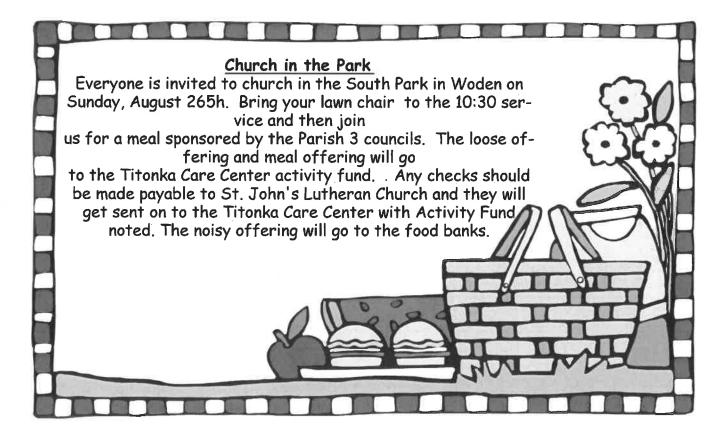
Please join us on August 18, 2019, to honor Rev. Ted Ager for his 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of his ordination.
