Dear Friends In Christ,

In 1973, Sandra went with her boyfriend and three other guys to the Gitchie Manatou state park near Rock Rapids, Iowa.

While relaxing around a campfire, three men came out of the darkness. They shot and killed the four guys and then one of the men abused Sandra.

Life became hopeless as Sandra suffered guilt and shame for over forty years. Then about 2019 at a book¹ signing, people lined up to tell her how much they had admired her. Finally, she could hold her head high as a hopeless time in her life was finally being put behind her.

Few of us experience this kind of trauma in lives. However, many of us do deal with the burden of tragedies and a longing for hope.

We are living in tragic days with COVID-19. Many are wondering who and when will get it next? Who will not get a needed hospital bed because there are so many COVID patients? Whose surgery will be delayed?

Quite honestly, I am not sensing a lot of hope these days. However, it is when we are without hope that God offers us the greatest hope. Now with December we are entering into a season that emphasizes hope, the season of Advent.

Advent is four weeks of hope. The color for Advent is blue, a calming color that often means serenity.

Our hope is looking forward to the coming of Jesus Christ, celebrating his first coming at Christmas and anxiously awaiting his second coming at an hour that only the Father in heaven knows.

What will Christmas be like this year? Will we be able to hold services? Will we be able to have family gatherings? Hopefully the answer to those questions is yes.

Perhaps one of the blessings out of this time in our lives is learning to look to God and trust Him in ways we have not done so in the past, thus giving us hope.

This year especially, set up an Advent wreath. As you decorate for Christmas, try putting out something blue to remind you of our hope in Jesus Christ.

These days are fearful and challenging. Do not let the hopelessness and fears overcome you. We have a much greater hope in Jesus Christ. Have a blessed Advent Season and Merry Christmas to all of you Pastor Kim

Dear friends and sponsors.

Happy Thanksgiving, and a blessed Advent season to you all!

I know that this holiday season will be unlike any other, with many of the usual celebrations and gatherings cancelled because of Covid-19. As cases surge in the upper Midwest, you are all in our prayers. I hope that you will stay safe and find meaningful ways to celebrate in spite the difficult circumstances.

Here in Cameroon, it seems we have been spared, so far, the high infection rates current in the United States. For the sake of comparison, there have been about 900 cases per million population in Cameroon, whereas in the U.S. it is over 40,000 per million population (www.worldometers. info/coronavirus/#countries). I will leave it to experts to explain why that is the case and simply say that I am very grateful that infection rates are not so high here. Hospitals would be very quickly overwhelmed if the situation were anything like that in the U.S.

At the Lutheran Institute of Theology, we were able to start the 2020-2021 academic year on schedule at the beginning of October. Our total number of students is around 50 as usual, but what is new this year is that we have seven female students – an all-time high! The first semester is progressing well.

That is all for now. I pray that the season of Advent and the expectation of our coming Savior will bring you hope and peace.
