March greetings,

There's a great old hymn that I catch myself humming and singing at surprising times, I Love to Tell the Story. The words are so very familiar—I've been singing them for decades now. As I was humming about the telling story I got to thinking—what is **the story** that matters most? What is **the story** that we Jesus' people love to tell and need keep on hearing ourselves.

There are so many stories people tell about church and Jesus.

He was a great teacher who understood the kingdom of God and announce that the kingdom was coming close to us.

Jesus spoke truth that changes how people seem themselves and their neighbors and the whole world.

Jesus was a true friend and people could spend a whole lot of time just remembering Jesus' friends.

People love to remember and celebrate Jesus' miracles.

There really are some great stories to tell about Jesus; but what's **the story** that changes everything for us Jesus' people?

I think about it as a two part story and we need to have both parts to have the whole story—and the hope they bring to this world.

The Good News—<u>the story</u> we love to tell is that our savior, Jesus, came to earth and that he died and he rose from the dead. People can rightly argue there's so much more to Jesus' story than the cross and the empty tomb. But deep down what happened in 3 days in Jerusalem is <u>the story</u> that changes everything.

This month we will tell the heart of our story as Jesus' people— Palm Sunday, March 24, 2024 we will remember the joy as Jesus arrived in Jerusalem.

Maundy Thursday, March 28, 2024 we will tell the story of the last supper and Jesus' promise to be with us in the bread and wine of Communion.

Good Friday, March 29, 2024 we will remember the cross and how Jesus died at a community service.

Easter Sunday, March 31 2024 we will hear the news that Jesus tomb is empty—that he has risen from them the dead.

10 MINUTE BIBLE STUDY



10 Minute Bible Study Philippians 2

There's a part of Paul's letter to the church in Philippi that some scholars think was originally a hymn of the early church. It's a great poem/lyric to think about as we come closer to Easter. There's something about this poem—that helps us see who Jesus really and what the cross and Easter is all about.

Read Philippians 2:1-2

Paul was inviting a young church to see how their lives were meant to fit together. What does it mean to have fellowship with other people in the church and to have fellowship with God?

Read Philippians 2:5

Paul invites us to follow Jesus starting with our thoughts and attitudes. What does it mean to have a mind/attitude like Jesus?

Read Philippians 2:6-7

Jesus was God and on this earth he was a man.

What does it mean to say that Jesus emptied himself/made himself nothing?

Reading Philippians 2:8

Jesus is God—with all power—but he humbled himself and obeyed God the Father's great plan.

How does remembering Jesus power help you understand his humility?

Read Philippians 2:9-11

Jesus was exalted—he was God's son—but the real glory came after his suffering. What does Jesus suffering, death, and resurrection teach us about our future as God's people?

Read Philippians 2:12-13

Paul is talking about living in faith—how we follow Jesus as both church and as individuals.

How is it Good News to know we stand before God in the light of Jesus' cross and resurrection?

A follow-up to Immanuel's annual meeting:

What is Mission Support?

There is a YouTube video created by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) called "Where Does Your Offering Go?" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MS2O8jnk5cg) that does a very good job explaining the components of a congregations' offerings. A summary of that clip and some data from the most recent Western Iowa Synod financial report follows:

For every dollar in the offering plate, congregations spend over 90% on themselves: their congregation leaders, their buildings, their ongoing expenses. As noted in the video clip, approximately 6% was forwarded to their synod in the form of "Mission Support". As reported in the fiscal 2022 Western Iowa Synod financial report, congregations in our synod gave a total \$739,320 to Mission Support. Immanuel's Mission Support was \$7,800, or approximately 1.1% of the total synod's Missions Support income. (continued on next page)

What is Mission Support? (continued)

How does the synod spend that Mission Support? Here's a breakdown:

\$262,000 was forwarded to Churchwide Mission Support¹

\$ 10,000 was given to Iowa Lutheran Campus Ministries

\$ 10,000 was given directly to ELCA seminaries

\$282,000 total support to ELCA ministries

\$457,000 Western Iowa Synod staff, program and events²

\$739,000 total

¹ What does the ELCA Churchwide do with their money?

Their national initiatives include:

growing the ELCA church;

creating new ministries in the US;

forming leaders with youth events, resources and tools;

supporting 7 ELCA seminaries and 26 ELCA colleges/universities;

engaging in interfaith and ecumenical dialogues;

being a voice to government leaders for the marginalized in society;

supporting Lutheran Services in America.

Their worldwide initiatives include:

involvement with the Lutheran World Federation;

companion synods;

forming new churches;

equipping leaders abroad; and

developing ELCA missionaries and (YAGM) Young Adults in Global Ministry.

Your 1.1% provided \$2,976 for these programs and services!

² And what does the Western Iowa Synod do?

Their time and efforts are categorized with 2022 programs in the following areas:

7% Advocacy - Lutheran Services of Iowa, Hog Program, Racial Justice Trip, work w/refugees

8% Communication - Waterlife Journal, Lent and Advent devotionals, congregation worships

13% Faith Formation – lifelong programs: baptism, youth and confirmation programs, sharing Holy Communion, preaching

30% Generosity – supporting food pantries, providing stewardship programs, disaster supplies, endowment distributions

15% Local and Global Ministries – supports companion synods in Tanzania and Chile, Lutheran World Relief, ELCA World Hunger

15% Governance – coordinate the synod assemblies, work with Synod Council and synod committees

12% Renewal – pastor calls, pastor ordinations, new congregations (LeMars), Fund for the Future (pastor seminary debt reduction)

Your 1.1% enabled \$4,824 for these programs and services!

There's a lot more info in the assembly reports at www.wisynod.org and also at www.ELCA.org.

You can see that your Mission Support dollars are used in a great variety of areas, ranging from local synod projects to national efforts and worldwide initiatives. It would be very difficult to support each of the above programs one by one, but by supporting "Mission Support", we combine with other ELCA congregations to make it happen. Gods Work. Our Hands.
