When I started ministry here in Iowa we took time to share stories about the history of our 3 churches.

Then in the month of June 2022, we took time to talk about future ministry.

The conversation started with a question:

What ministry would you like to be part of in the next 1 to 60 months?

In the next two months I'm going to be asking this question again.

The question might be the same, but the answers might very well be different.

My goal is to get all of us thinking together about the future God is inviting all of us into as church. The culture we live in is changing—and our mission as church is to go into this culture with the Good News. To help us get talking this year I am going to invite you to think about the core values of Lutheran Church of Hope in West Des Moines IA. This church is growing fast—and what really intrigues me isn't the growth of this church but their core values.

Hope's Core Values are straightforward:

- 1. Jesus is life. The rest is details.
- 2. Lost people matter to God and so they matter to us.
- 3. We worship God, not tradition.
- 4. Following Jesus is a growing experience.
- 5. We are one body, united in Jesus Christ.

This summer as we think about our future we will use these 5 core values to help shape our conversations and how we want step together in ministry in the future.

10 MINUTE BIBLE STUDY



Acts 2 – Pentecost

Read Acts 2:1-4

Pentecost was an old religious festival. Every year people gathered 50 days after Passover in Jerusalem. It was a tradition, a harvest festival. People came from all over the world to celebrate God's faithfulness over the generations. And in the middle of this traditional religious gathering God moved.

What do you imagine it would be like if people came to church expecting a traditional celebration only to feel God's presence moving them in new ways?

Read Acts 2:5-13

The list of people who came to Jerusalem for Pentecost helps us get a sense for how far God's spirit can reach into our world. This was a gathering of Jewish people from many cultures who lived in different empires like Persia and Rome. And as they gathered together they felt God move.

The people asked a question, "what does this mean?" How do you answer that question?

Read Acts 2:14-21

Peter, an early leader of the church, tried to answer the question by pointing backwards to the scriptures. He pointed to the old prophet Joel. He pointed to the promise of God's power from generations before.

Why do you think Peter pointed backwards?

Read Acts 2:22-36

Peter was preaching a great sermon. He was pointing back to scripture and explaining who Jesus was. Peter understood that God was creating a brand new future in Jesus. How do you see the new future taking shape?

Read Acts 2:37-40

Peter's words reached many people's hearts. God was doing something new and many people would experience both God's grace and a deep feeling of conviction. God was up to something new and that meant acknowledging the past.

Read Acts 2:41-47

The church came to life that first Pentecost. And the good news hasn't stopped spreading in our world.

What evidence do you see of the spirits movement in our life together as church? Where do you see God calling the church and the future?

News from the Titonka Care Center

Thank you to the community for your generosity in supporting projects at the Titonka Care Center.

Due to your generosity at last summer's fundraiser (meal after Indian Day parade) we were able to completely finance the cement work and construction of an outdoor shelter. The concrete work is complete and the construction of the shelter is slated start March 28. By the time you are reading this, the shelter should be well on its way to completion.

Another project currently in process is painting. The entryway, front room, hallways and dining room have gotten a facelift. The dining room hallway will be freshened up next. Again, generous donations are making this possible. Stop in and see how great it looks.

We also have been able to replace the tables in the dining room thanks to proceeds from the Good Hope Women's lasagna dinner. Thank you for thinking of us!

The updates and repairs at the Titonka Care Center are ongoing. After 50 years in existence, replacement and repairs become necessary. There is a wish list of items needing to be done. If there is a group you belong to and are looking for a project to help fund, feel free to stop at the Care Center and talk to Corey about the list. Some are big projects and some are smaller ones.

We will be again be hosting the fundraiser dinner following the Quasquicentennial parade on Saturday, June 24, 2023. This year's proceeds will be used to replace doors and windows. This is a big project, but a very necessary project. We will be looking for many volunteers to make this a success.

We are currently looking for volunteers to deliver Meals on Wheels to our local residents still in their home, just needing a home cooked meal. There has been some interest from neighboring communities to also use this service. That, too, will require volunteers to deliver.

Our resident count is slowing increasing. We have room for several more residents. If you or someone you know is looking for a place to recuperate after illness or injury or needing to make the move to a care facility, come take a look. We think you will like what you see!

Again, thank you for your generosity in supporting the community owned Titonka Care Center. It is very much appreciated.

As part of the project's efforts, we recruit, train, license and support Native American families in accord with the traditions, needs and resources of their communities.

Rebecca and Kirby expanded their family when they adopted their son in January. The couple had the opportunity to work with the Omaha Tribe and were able to participate in the second Customary Adoption in the State of Iowa.

The new family also was able to keep their son connected to his biological siblings, so he can continue to be involved with them.
