But for kids who have experienced trauma, back-to-school season can bring additional stress: anxiety about meeting new people; worry that their family may not have enough grocery money for lunch every day; insecurity if they come to school without some of the fun supplies other kids have.

Thanks to donations of backpacks, crayons and pencils, glue, and more, LSI is ensuring Iowa youth have access to the school supplies they need to succeed. And because of this, kids are empowered with the ability to choose their own supplies that show off their own styles and personalities so they can feel confident as they return to classes.

Dear Friends,

It is hard to imagine a life without our loved ones. It is probably safe to say we don't like to think about it even in situations where there is advance notice, such as the case with a serious illness. Life, however, has a way of taking our blinders off and forcing us to consider the unimaginable, the thing we do not want to happen. You are living it right now. The brain can only comprehend so much information at one time. This helps explain why we don't consider the other losses we will experience while grieving until they happen.

These other losses, often referred to as "secondary losses", can catch people by surprise. It is not so clear, especially soon after a death, how many ripple effects we can feel. Many bereaved we spoke with in the past often referenced the following observations:

w I didn't know how much he/she did around the home, can I maintain the current housing arrangement?

w Loss of companionship - social supports can change

w Mom/dad was my "cheerleader"

w Who is in charge of the family, especially after the death of the second parent?

w How do I support my family who is also grieving?

Now is a good time to consider the various resources available within your community or region. Food banks or a mobile pantry can help with groceries. Elderbridge Agency on Aging has information on multiple services available to senior citizens including home repairs, medical needs, or financial assistance. Salvation Army or community action groups can direct you for rental or heating assistance. Ask someone at your bank to help draft a new budget or assist with payment schedules if you are new to the responsibility of paying bills. If you are still working, consider utilizing the Employee Assistance Program through your company to access free counseling services.

It is hard to be vulnerable and ask for help but remember it is not a weakness. You don't have to struggle alone, and we are not meant to do everything by ourselves.
