The St. John's WOW kids will again be packing back packs with new school supplies for children overseas who are less fortunate. They will be shipped through Lutheran World Relief. The supplies will go into the backpacks which Deb Schimmelpfennig and Phyllis Schutjer have made. We try to send at least 60 every year. We need your help to fill them!!! Supplies can be dropped off at St. John's or Immanuel.

The following is what is needed for each kit:

Four (4) 70 sheet notebooks – wide or college ruled paper – no loose leaf

One (1) 30- centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

One (1) pencil sharpener

One (1) blunt pair scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Five (5) black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with rubber band

Five (5) unsharpened pencils with erasers; secured together with rubber band

One (1) box of crayons – 16 or 24 count


One (1) 2 ½ inch eraser
